### Procession

- I. The procession will form on the road along the west and north sides of the Green Hall quadrangle at 5:45 P.M. Sunday, June 1, 1969.
- II. Graduates and faculty will line up four abreast with the head of the procession facing south on the road in front of Kendall Hall. Markers will be placed on the quadrangle to indicate where the members of each curricula and groups will assemble.

The procession will form in the following order:

\*Department chairmen and the chairman of graduate study will assume responsibility for designating the order in the procession and for seating for students in their areas so that they will be in the proper seats for receiving their diplomas. They will also designate assistants for each table.

- III. At the signal from the marshals the procession will proceed along the road toward the athletic field. At the walk going diagonally from the road the pair on the left side will proceed to the gate at the south-east side of the football field. Those on the right side will continue on the road to the gate at the northeast side of the football field. The band will start playing when the two columns are assembled at the gates. Each column will proceed west along the track on their respective sides to the rear of the seats in the football field. They will then turn toward the center of the field and proceed down the center aisle to the assigned seats as shown on the seating diagram. Remain standing at your seats for the National Anthem.

### Conferring of Degrees

When Bachelor's degrees are to be conferred, President Heussler will present the entire class to Dr. Fred D. Rosi who will confer the degree. The class should rise when so instructed by President Heussler after he has presented the class to Dr. Rosi. At a signal from the class president who will step forward facing the class, the graduates will change their tassels from the right side to the left front side of the cap. The class will be seated when so instructed by President Heussler.

Candidates for the M.A. degree will rise and be presented to Dr. Fred Rosi after the Bachelor's degrees have been awarded. They will be seated after the degree has been conferred.

After degrees have been conferred upon all candidates, music will begin and students in the graduating class will rise upon signal from the president and go to the tables near the rows in which they are seated. Faculty representatives of each department will present the diplomas to the graduates and they will return to their seats. Please remain standing for the singing of the Alma Mater and for the benediction.

Graduate students will receive their diplomas at the same time as the undergraduate students but will not be separated by departments. They will receive their diplomas from the tables at the end of the rows in which they are seated.

### Recessional

The President's party will be the first to leave their seats. They will form in a double column in front of the platform and follow the marshal to the north east gate and to Green Hall.

The graduates, beginning with the front row, will follow the student marshals in two columns of two each. The column composed of those on the south side of the center aisle will use the south east gate and those on the north side will exit through the gate at the north east end of the field. The columns will join at the road and proceed to the front of Green Hall where they will disperse.

The faculty will follow the last of the graduates using both gates.

### Guests

Faculty guests will be seated on chairs immediately behind the faculty on the football field.

Guests of graduates will be seated on bleachers on both sides of the football field and on bleachers and chairs at the west end of the field.

### General Instructions

1. Refer to accompanying diagram in connection with the foregoing instructions.
2. Men remove hats only during the singing of the National Anthem, the Alma Mater, and during the invocation and benediction.
3. Tassels should be worn on the right front side for Bachelor's degree candidates and on the left front side for Master's degree candidates.
4. Academic costumes may be obtained at the Old Inn at the following times:  
(Students must show their I.D. card)  
Monday, May 26, from 1-3:30 p.m. and from 7-9 p.m.  
Tuesday, May 27, from 8:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m. and 7-9 p.m.  
Wednesday, May 28, from 8:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m. and 7-9 p.m.  
Thursday, May 29, from 8:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m.

Academic costumes should be returned immediately following Commencement Exercises to the east end of the old gymnasium in Packer Hall.

Inclement Weather Plan

The College will not schedule a rain date. In the case of inclement weather:

1. There will not be a formal academic procession.
2. If outdoor ceremonies are cancelled, announcements will be made during the afternoon on area radio stations (WHWH-1350, WBUD-1260, WTTM-920, WCTC 1450 WCRV-1580, WKDN-800, WJLK-1310).
3. Only the graduates, B.A. and M.A. candidates, will attend a commencement program in Kendall Auditorium at 6 P.M. Seating is not assigned.
4. The diplomas will be awarded at specific locations on campus after the indoor program (approximately 7 P.M.) Parents and guests would be admitted to the departmental ceremonies on a first--come basis as room capacity permits. This plan allows each graduate to receive his diploma on an individual basis from the department chairman.
