Procession

- I. The procession will form on the road along the west and north sides of the Green Hall quadrangle (Quimby's Prairie) at 4:45 P.M. Sunday, June 4, 1972.
- II. Graduates and faculty will line up four abreast with the head of the procession facing south on the road in front of Kendall Hall. Markers will be placed on the quadrangle to indicate where the members of each group will assemble.

The procession will form in the following order:

- A. Presidential Party (in a column of two)
- B. Faculty
 1. Professors
 2. Associate Professors
 3. Assistant Professors
 4. Instructors
- C. Candidates for Masters Degrees
- D. Candidates for Bachelors Degrees

*Faculty will be led by the Faculty Marshals.

Candidates for Masters Degrees will be led by the Graduate Student Marshals.

Candidates for Bachelors Degree will be led by Class Marshals.

The appropriate Marshals will direct faculty and students to the proper seats on the football field.

There is no particular order of lining up for the procession within the several groups listed.

III. At the signal from the marshals, the procession will move along the road toward the athletic field. At the walk going diagonally from the road, the procession will split into two columns of two. The pairs on the left side will proceed to the gate at the southeast side of the football field. Those on the right side will continue on the road to the gate at the northeast side of the football field. Each column will proceed to the assigned seats as shown on the diagram. Remain standing at your seats for the National Anthem.

Conferring of Degrees

When Bachelor's degrees are to be conferred, Dr. Brower will present the entire class to Dr. Fred Rosi, Chairman of the Board of Trustees. The class will rise when so instructed by Dr. Brower after he has presented the class to Dr. Rosi. Dr. Rosi will confer the degrees. At a signal from the class president who will step forward facing the class, the graduates will change their tassels from the right side to the left front side of the cap. The class will be seated when so instructed by Dr. Brower.

Candidates for the M.A. and M.Ed. degrees will be presented to Dr. Fred Rosi after the Bachelor's degrees have been awarded. They will rise, have the degree conferred, and be seated again.

Recession

The presidential party will leave first. They will form in a double column and follow the marshal to the northeast gate and to Green Hall.

The faculty will leave next following the faculty marshals in two columns of two. The front row will leave first followed by the others in turn. The recession will disperse at Green Hall.

Masters Degree graduates will follow the Graduate Student Marshals.

Bachelors Degree graduates will follow class marshals. The front row will leave first, followed by the others in turn. The recession will disperse at Green Hall.

Guests

Guests of the college will be seated on chairs immediately behind the faculty on the football field.

Guests of graduates will be seated on bleachers on both sides of the football field and on bleachers and chairs at the west end of the field.

Awarding Diplomas

Bachelors degree diplomas will be awarded by the students' major department shortly after the formal graduation ceremony. Masters degree diplomas will be given by the Graduate Division. The diplomas will be given at the locations listed below. Parents and guests will be admitted to the departmental ceremonies as room capacity permits and will be invited to meet the chairmen and faculty members of the departments informally after the respective ceremonies.

4. Academic costumes may be obtained at the Old Inn at the following times:

Tuesday, May 30, thru Friday, June 2, from 8:30 A.M.-3:30 P.M. and 7-9 P.M.
Saturday, June 3, from 9 A.M. to 3 P.M., and Sunday, June 4, from 1-3 P.M.

Day students are requested to pick up costumes during day hours if at all possible.

Inclement Weather Plan

The College will not schedule a rain date. In the case of inclement weather:

1. There will not be a formal academic procession.
2. If outdoor ceremonies are cancelled, announcements will be made during the afternoon on area radio stations (WHWH-1350, WTTM-920, WCTC-1450, WCRV-1580, WKDN-800, WJLK-1310, WBUD-1260).
3. Diplomas will be awarded at the departmental ceremonies at the specific locations listed in this bulletin (see "Awarding Diplomas"). If outside ceremonies are cancelled, departmental ceremonies will begin at 5 o'clock. Parents and guests will be admitted to the departmental ceremonies on a first-come, first-served basis, as room capacity permits.
